Our program funding was affected by the political climate and DEI cutbacks, yet our youth remained fully committed. Thanks to the unwavering dedication of our instructors and volunteers—many providing pro bono support—we were able to keep our programs running strong.

We are especially grateful to the **Minnesota Humanities Center**, our very first donor to the Innovation Lab in 2024. Their support allowed us to transition from a successful 2023 pilot program to a fully launched program that continues to impact youth in transformative ways.

Performance Outcomes

The Innovation Lab youth met or exceeded expectations in two major areas—workshops and courses—and came very close to surpassing our goals in all four categories. I am filled with pride every time I witness our youth embracing creativity and growth. They inspire me to keep our momentum strong.

It has been my lifelong dream to create a space where women, youth, and families are immersed in a safe and inspiring environment—a place where they do not need permission to be creative. The Innovation Lab is a **sacred space** where art, music, and literature thrive in the hearts of all who embrace our mission and vision.
